# CHECKLIST

This checklist will be helpful to keep track of the necessary steps in preparing for camp:

## ***Right Now:***

- Return *Yellow* Information Sheet** (complete with current picture of camper - Email Photo if you wish).
- Return *White* Camper/Parent Expectation Sheet.**
- Return *Green* Travel Planner.**

## ***Coming Up:***

- Pay balance of camp fee on May 1, 2012.**  
\*\*Please update any new credit card information\*\*
- Return Health Certificate**(included in Spring mailing). Please make sure any changes in health status before camp are updated *in writing* directly with the camp office.
- Advise camp of any extra tuck deposit.** (After you receive Spring mailing)
- Pay final balance on May 31, 2012.**

Please make sure that **ALL** forms are completed **IN FULL**. **ALL** information is vital for a successful camp stay!

# TRANSPORTATION

**CAMPERS TAKING OUR CHARTERED BUSES** - Those taking our supervised buses begin their camp fun in Toronto! These buses (washroom and video equipped) leave **Home Depot Yorkdale**, Highway 401 and Dufferin St. (**90 Billy Bishop Way, on the North Side of Highway 401 across from Yorkdale Shopping Centre**) at **10 am each opening Monday**, returning at **4:15 pm on closing Sundays** (traffic permitting). Cost is \$160 round-trip (\$125 one-way). Pick-ups and drop-offs can be arranged for Barrie and Gravenhurst - see page 12 in this guide for full details! (Some Ohio, Michigan, New York and Quebec parents are able to take advantage of a weekend in Toronto and also put their campers on the camp bus). *International (inc. US) campers will need a passport physically at camp in case of emergency medi-vac return. Chartered bus campers will need funds for a McDonald's lunch in Gravenhurst.*

**CAMPERS ARRIVING IN TORONTO BY AIR** - Campers travelling by air from Quebec, Eastern Canada, Ohio, Michigan, Illinois and North-Eastern US - please plan a flight arrival in Toronto *well* before 9 am for transfer to the camp bus. C.A.C. ground services will meet all flights and transfer campers directly to camp buses. (\$75 each way). Campers from Europe, the Middle East, South East Asia, South America, far USA and Western Canada - along with those from closer centres with no early Monday morning flights - C.A.C. will meet all flights and accommodate your camper, with full supervision, on the Sunday night at each end of the camp stay, as necessary. *International (inc. U.S.) campers will need a passport physically at camp in case of emergency medi-vac return. Campers with electronic tickets must supply a photo copy or E-mail of the confirmation/receipt to the camp office. (If travelling by plane campers will be expected to turn in cell phones upon arrival at camp)*

**RETURN FLIGHTS** - Do not book return flights from Toronto on Sunday leaving before 7:30pm (transfer to Toronto airport and check-in cannot be completed properly before that time). All campers under the age of 12 and others also requesting Unaccompanied Minor status on the flight from Toronto, must provide a deposit of \$100 against possible airline costs demanded from the C.A.C. rep. at the Toronto airport. *(Credit Card info is sufficient)*

**CAMPERS ARRIVING IN TEMAGAMI BY PRIVATE CAR** - Campers arriving by car **MUST** be at the Lake Temagami Access Road (Manito) dock on opening Mondays by **3:30 pm** (Please note that we are unable to receive visitors at camp on opening days). Driving instructions to the dock can be found on page 8 of this booklet. **RETURN** - Campers travelling home by car are to be picked up at **9:15 am** on closing Sundays (some parents come to our Saturday Visitors Day, spend the night in the area, then meet their campers Sunday morning for the drive home together - see page 9 for Visitor Day information).

## MISCELLANEOUS

Water transportation will be provided to all campers from the Lake Temagami Access Road dock to Adventure island at \$30 per camper (round-trip) including luggage (This charge is indicated on your statement of account included in this mailing).

Please let us know if you have any difficulty with travel arrangements - we have a great amount of information and are always ready to help. Our Spring mailing will include: Health Certificate, a Special Note from the C.A.C. Tuck Shop, Final Words, etc.

## SPECIAL PREPARATIONS

- ✓ All clothing and personal items **MUST** be marked with at least your camper's LAST name (using permanent marker or laundry-proof name tapes).
- ✓ Do not send expensive clothing, heirlooms, jewellery, etc. to camp. We cannot be responsible for any personal items which are lost or damaged.
- ✓ All medicines that your child brings to camp must be in their original packaging and must be kept in our medical centre and dispensed by our health staff. For children who use inhalers, please send one or two extra (to be kept in the medical centre), also eyeglasses for contact-wearers in case of loss. Insect repellants should be of the **non-pressurized** variety and have a Deet concentrate of 10% for ages 11 and under and 30% for all others.
- ✓ Follow Kit List on next page carefully - it is not necessary for campers to bring anything more than the items listed - all 4, 6 & 8 week campers receive laundry service at no charge!

# KIT LIST FOR ALL CAMPERS

## THESE ITEMS MUST BE BROUGHT BY EVERYONE!

◆ **Travel to camp wearing:** windbreaker, T-shirt, shorts, socks and running shoes (or other **SOFT** soles, sandals, etc.) AND carry (or pack on TOP of bag) a **PROPERLY** fitting **GOVERNMENT-APPROVED LIFE JACKET** or **PFJ**.◆

- Swim wear
- 8 prs of socks
- 1 pr extra footwear (soft soles, please)
- 10 prs of underwear
- Several t-shirts/sweatshirts
- Sport shirts
- 2 sweaters
- 3 towels and face cloth  
(2 towels should be bath size)
- 4 - 5 prs of camp shorts  
(cut-offs & athletic shorts are fine)
- Special event outfit - For Awards Banquet  
(BOYS: sport shirt and WHITE or light colour tennis-type shorts;  
GIRLS: skirt or dress (sundress/minis, etc. are fine)
- Knife/fork/spoon; Bowl/plate/mug (for hikes/trips)  
(A clip-together cutlery set prevents loss; bowl/plate/mug should be unbreakable)
- Ground sheet  
(heavy piece of plastic will do - for overnight tent trip)
- Sleeping Bag
- Pillow (Packed to stay clean and dry)
- Extra blanket
- 2 sheet liners for sleeping bag (can be bought or easily made by folding and stitching regular sheets into bag shape)
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Toothbrush/paste, shampoo, brush, etc. (Shampoo **MUST** be biodegradable)
- Insect Repellent (ages 11 and under with 10% Deet, others 30%)  
(NO PRESSURIZED SPRAYS please!)
- Sun screen (consult your pharmacist for most suitable product)
- Amusing camp hat
- Paper, pens, pencils, etc.
- Rain wear
- Campfire blanket (See instructions Page 11)

# PACKING TIPS

Weekly Laundry service is provided for all 4, 6 and 8 week campers at no charge.

Pack everything in **SOFT** dunnage or **Medium** hockey bags  
(No trunks, suitcases or goalie bags please!)

# HOW TO REACH TEMAGAMI BY ROAD

Ontario Provincial Highways 11 or 17 will take you to North Bay. The Town of Temagami is situated on Hwy. 11 at a distance of 98 km (59 mi) north of North Bay. (You will pass a prominent C.A.C. billboard on the east side of the highway about 80 km (50 mi) north of North Bay.)

Three miles south of Temagami (or 93 km (56 mi) north of North Bay) you will find the *Lake Temagami Access Road*. (A 2<sup>nd</sup> C.A.C. billboard is visible on the east side of the highway opposite the Access Road). The Access Road (rough & dusty!!) runs west from Hwy. 11 for a distance of 20 km (12 mi) - travel to the far end of the road, passing Boat Line Bay Marine. Turn right at the fork in the road towards the Manito Landing. Our water craft operate from this point directly to Adventure Island. Boats leave for camp *on Visitor Days* from 9:30-10:30 am (reminder - boats leave for camp *with campers* on session-opening Mondays at 3:30pm!) Boats return from camp *on Visitor Days* from 4:30-5:30 pm (reminder - boats return from camp *with campers* on closing-Sundays at 9:15 am!) Driving time from Toronto or Ottawa is approximately 5 hours.

# C.A.C. VISITOR DAYS 2012!

**TO ALL PARENTS AND FRIENDS** - This is your personal invitation to attend one of our Visitor Days, meet our camp staff and enjoy the camp activities, along with our famous Northern Buffet Lunch! See campers involved in regular camp activities including: Drama, Music, Crafts, Trampolining, Gymnastics, Dance, Land Sports and Water Sports - great entertainment to amaze and delight you! Bring your swimsuit and sample the joys of C.A.C. (But due to the fragile natural environment and the allergic reactions of some children, we ask that you *please don't bring your dog* or other pet when you visit camp!)

We will welcome you to Adventure Island from 10 am to 4:00 pm on any of our Visitor Days - every other Saturday: July 7, July 21, Aug. 4 and Aug. 18. Water transportation to camp on these days leaves from the Information Booth (Manito dock) at the end of the Lake Temagami Access Road between 9:30 & 10:30 am. Boats return to the dock between 4:30 & 5:30 pm. Please note! There can *sometimes* be a considerable wait for boats at the dock to travel to camp ( it is a 16-mile round trip, after all!) ... consider bringing a book, relax, unwind, enjoy the scenery, we will not start our program until everyone has arrived at camp! Special water transport rate, at these times, is \$30/person round trip for adults, \$28 for children (11 yrs and under); Northern Buffet is \$16 for adults and \$10 for children! Please consider the expenses ahead of time and come prepared - all fees are payable on arrival at camp (sorry, no credit cards are accepted at camp).

Many of our visitors enjoy staying in the area whilst visiting camp, so we have listed on page 8 some island resorts right on Lake Temagami, a nearby highway inn, and several hostelrys in North Bay. The island resorts offer quiet cabin accommodation, with meals in the main lodge. Most of the Inns have fine dining rooms. The cosmopolitan City of North Bay (just south of us) offers a variety of accommodation, dining and entertainment facilities.

Visitor Days are NOT the last day of a camp session! Please do not plan to take campers with you when leaving! Last nights are very special to cabin groups and it is unfair to your camper and the rest of the cabin to mar the experience by premature departure .

☛ Speaking of mail...**DO** remember to write to your camper!

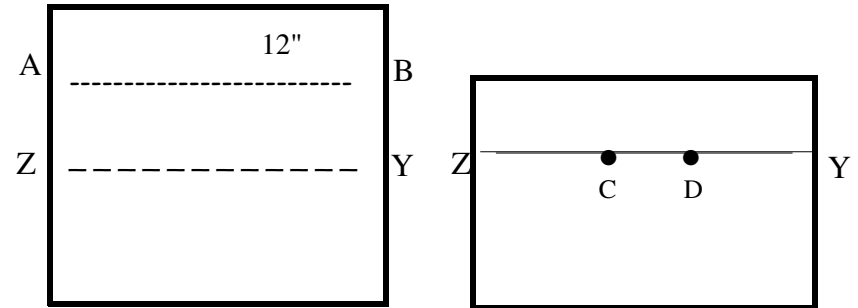

☛ We recommend positive, bright, newsy letters to support your camper (ask questions of younger campers to give them an idea of things you would like to hear about). **NO FOOD PARCELS, PLEASE!** Please note that Special Delivery, Priority Post or Courier services will **DELAY** your letter as it must be picked up in the town of Temagami.

☛ If you get a letter from your camper written in a less than enthusiastic manner, perhaps describing some terminal illness, personal trauma or near fatal experience (!!), **DO NOT OVERREACT!!** (Remember - children know how to pull your string - the situation probably cleared up long before the letter left the island!) We would contact you, of course, if there was need. If you get **several** negative letters and feel there may be a real problem, then, of course, let us know and we will take action.

# HOW TO MAKE A CAMPFIRE BLANKET



Fold blanket down at A-B (approximately 12" from top edge). Stitch securely at point Z and point Y (makes arm holes.) Supply Toggle & Eye fastener or lacing at C/D to close comfortably around neck. If the blanket is too long, turn up and sew bottom. Exterior of blanket can be decorated with badges, coloured patches, etc.

This is just one simple way of making a campfire blanket. There are other methods including cutting a hole in the center of a blanket for the head and providing lacing.

### **Please Note:**

To use the above pick-up and drop-off points, please complete details on the green Travel Planner and inform your camper. C.A.C. will pick-up/drop-off campers exactly according to the Travel Planner received from you *If your plans change, you must advise our office and your camper (if at camp) in writing.* Please note that times for pick-ups and drop-offs are **dependent upon traffic conditions.** Arrive on time at each location - buses are, of course, unable to wait for you if you are late! Look for C.A.C. staff at Home Depot Yorkdale (Sundays at 4pm) to get updates on arrival time for each bus.
